REQUIRED COURSEWORK An Asterisk indicates that the course is recommended but not required to graduate.

9TH GRADE

English 9
Math (Pre-Algebra, Algebra I, Geometry)
Physical Science
Physical Education (may also be filled in 10th, 11th, or 12th grades)

10TH GRADE

English 10
Math (Pre-Algebra, Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II)
Biology
Physical Education (may also be filled in 11th or 12th grade)
U.S. History I

11TH GRADE

English 11
*World History (required to earn the “Advanced” Diploma) **Strongly recommended for all students.**
Health
Science (Anatomy/Physiology or Chemistry recommended — 3 years of lab science are required for a High School Diploma)
Math (Algebra II, Pre-Calculus, A. P. Calculus recommended — 3 years of math are required for a High School Diploma)

12TH GRADE

English 12 (**which includes a senior project**).
American Government
Consumer Economics/Speech
Humanities – Music, Art, Foreign Language. 2 credits (1 year) required for the “Standard” Diploma, 4 credits (2 years) for the “Advanced” Diploma. In order to earn the “Advanced” diploma, 2 credits (1 year) of the humanities must be foreign language. Humanities includes music, art and foreign language classes. Humanities may be completed at any time during high school.
Science (Anat/Phys, Chemistry, Physics, Zoology or Botany. 3 years of lab science are required for a High School Diploma).
*Math (Algebra II, Pre-Calculus, A. P. Calculus recommended (4 years of math are required for the “Advanced” Diploma).
(At least two of the math credits must be taken during the senior year).

******IMPORTANT POINTS TO REMEMBER******

Point #1 **ALL STUDENTS MUST NOW PASS THE IDAHO STANDARDS ACHIEVEMENT TEST (ISAT) IN ORDER TO GRADUATE FROM HIGH SCHOOL.**

Point #2 **“ADVANCED” DIPLOMA OPTION** –In addition to the “Standard” Diploma, a student may now choose to earn an “Advanced” Diploma from North Fremont. To do so, you must take 4 years of Math, 3 years of Science, 1 year of World History, and 2 years of humanities, one year of which must be a foreign language. **To earn a North Fremont “Advanced” Diploma, the following credit requirements are in force: The graduating class of 2010 must earn 54 credits, and all graduating classes thereafter must earn 56 credits.** (Fremont County Joint School District 215: Policy 605.0: *Graduation*)

Point #3 Eligibility Rules For Participation in Extracurricular Activities – Eligibility to participate in school – sponsored extracurricular activities is governed by the Idaho High School Activities Association and by the Fremont County School Board. The School Principal monitors eligibility throughout the year. **STAY ELIGIBLE – EARN GOOD GRADES!**

Point #4 Teacher Aideships – The aideships are for Seniors and are offered primarily for vocational experience and growth. Aideships are available in the Library, Elementary School, and selected secondary classrooms.

Point #5 Most Colleges and Universities now require 4 years of Math and 4 years of Science from accredited high schools.

(All courses are open to everyone regardless of race, sex, religion and marital status)
